MARINA GRUT (MRS M KEET DE GRUT)

Dame of the Order of Queen Isabel of Spain Hon. Life President of the Spanish Dance Society (SDS) Professorial Lecturer Emeritus, George Washington University, USA Member of the *Conseil International de la Danse* (CID)



In 1989 King Juan Carlos I of Spain invested Marina Grut as Dame of the Order of

Queen Isabel of Spain (*Lazo de Dama de la Orden de Isabel la Católica*), given in recognition of her services in presentation and preservation of Spanish dance. The award has also been given to esteemed artistes like Carmen Amaya and Antonio. In Sweden she received from Princess Christina the 2008 Gold Medal of the Carina Ari Foundation "for honouring the art of Swedish dance" with her book *Royal Swedish Ballet. History from 1592 to 1962* (Georg Olms Verlag, Hildesheim, 2007).

In 1987 Grut was presented with the Special Achievement award by the Hispanic Institute for the Performing Arts in the USA. In 1997 the Spanish Dance Society in the USA presented a Lifetime Achievement Award to her, and the Mayor of Washington named a day in her honour. The International Association of Blacks in Dance bestowed "the Outstanding Service Award for many years of service to dance in Metropolitan Washington DC" in 2003.

Grut studied ballet at the University of Cape Town Ballet School in South Africa and danced in their company, before her love for Spanish dancing led her to specialize in that art form. She taught Spanish dance and ballet history, and choreographed.

Besides the above-mentioned Swedish ballet book Grut has written numerous articles for dance magazines and international encyclopaedias, and the books *Spanish Dance* (University of Cape Town, 1971), *The History of Ballet in South Africa* (Human & Rousseau, Cape Town, 1981), *The Jota* (Spanish Dance Society, 2001), *The Bolero School* (Dance Books Ltd, London, 2002), and her autobiography *My Dancing Life – Spanish and Ballet Across Three Continents* (The Book Guild Ltd, 2017). She also contributed to the Spanish Ministry of Culture's symposium *Encuentro Escuela Bolera* in Madrid in 1992.

She choreographed not only many performances for the University of Cape Town Ballet Company but also major ballets such as *Misa Flamenca* and *The Three-Cornered Hat*, as well as several ballets for the Cape Performing Arts Board; for the *Danza Lorca* company *Percussion Bolero* and *The Magic Circle*, also in Cape Town. In some of these the Spanish dancer José Antonio (Ruiz) , the former Director of the Spanish National Ballet, was guest artist.

She co-founded the Spanish Dance Society in South Africa in 1965; notating, printing and publishing the syllabus and the music. In 1977 she founded a branch in Italy, and in 1982 in the USA. There, between 1982 and 1993, she taught Spanish dancing at the University of Maryland and, as Professorial Lecturer, at George Washington University in Washington DC.

There she also founded the Spanish Dance Theatre company in 1982. The company presented performances and lecture-demonstrations at venues such as the Kennedy Center, the Smithsonian Institute, the National Gallery of Art, and the National Geographic Society in Washington DC, opening the Goya exhibition in Boston with dances from that era; and in New York at the Juilliard School of Music, as well as annual performances in the historic theatre of the Museum of Natural History.

In June 2003 she presented a lecture-demonstration on the *Escuela Bolera* at the New Orleans International Ballet Conference, celebrating the Louisiana Purchase.

Now she lives in London, where she is Hon. Life Working President of the Spanish Dance Society. She writes for *The Dancing Times* in London, and was a critic for the now discontinued *Flamenco International Magazine*. Born 1934, married for more than 60 years to Dr Mikael Grut. They have three children and eight grandchildren.

ISABEL BAQUERO WHITE – BA (Hons) A.R.A.D.

Isabel Baquero is a professional Choreographer, Dance Coach and Performer.

She originally trained at her parents Dance Academy in Barcelona in Classical Ballet, flamenco, folk/classical Spanish dance, jazz, tap, roller skating and ballroom dancing!

In 1990 Isabel came to the UK on a scholarship, where she successfully completed and graduated with Honours in the "Dance Performers" Course at the London Studio Centre and was awarded the 'Advanced Certificate' from the Royal Academy of Dance.



She has worked as a professional dancer in several productions for the BBC, including *Wives and Daughters, Madam Bovary* and *Daniel Deronda*, and has performed in various films, notably *Shakespeare in Love, I Capture the Castle* and *Pride and Prejudice*, in which she was also appointed Assistant Choreographer. Isabel has performed in many productions with the English National Opera and the Royal Opera in Covent Garden. She has had a very influential role in the choreography department and as lead Dancer and Dance Captain in Sir Richard Eyre's production of *La Traviata* for the past 25 years in London, China, Germany, Japan and Barcelona!

Her choreography credits include flamenco dance in *Strictly Dance Fever* in both 2005 and 2006, *Barber of Seville* for Garsington Opera, *Carmen* at Longborough Opera, *La Rondine* at the Royal Opera House, Movement Director of *The House of Bernarda de Alba* at the Theatre Clwyd and Flamenco Dance Coach & Choreographer in Mike Leigh's film *Happy Go Lucky*. Isabel was also the flamenco dance coach on BBC1's *Strictly Come Dancing*, and for Ray Quinn & Maria Filippov in the 2014 series of ITV's *Dancing on Ice*. She has a B.A. (Hons.) degree in Dance Education from Middlesex University. Isabel's final year dissertation was focused on 'The Impact and Values of Spanish Dance training in the Cultural Education and Performing Arts in Great Britain'.

Her choreography work is featured in the acclaimed Warner Brothers film *Wonder Woman* (2017) directed by Patty Jenkins with actors Chris Pine, Dany Huston and Gal Gadot.

Isabel currently works as a freelance Choreographer and guest dance teacher in prominent Performing Arts Institutions such as Lamda, the Arts Educational School and as a Movement coach in the prestigious Jette Parker Young Artists Programme at the Royal Opera House. FIDELIO


The Spanish Dance Society was honoured with the Fidelio award in 2017 in recognition of its major contribution to the Washington DC arts community.

Our fabulous Señoras and Señoritas down here in the beautiful 'garden of England' are still signing up with the SDS. The Folkestone Channel Tunnel and Dover Port are very much part of our lives, as in this part of the world we have many budding 'Flamenco Afficionado's' going backwards and forwards to their second homes in Spain.

A brief history of the SDS in Kent will tell you that it was started at the Hasland School of Dance in the Victorian seaside resort of Herne Bay in 1982 where we had our first examination session. It quickly progressed to establishing a second base in Broadstairs at the Page Mason School. A small company under the South East Centre for Spanish Dance soon developed where many performances were done throughout Kent over the years. Companies such as Euro Tunnel, Radio Kent, TVEI, Ashford Burrough Council, Gulbenkian Theatre and Tunbridge Wells Corn Exchange loved having our SDS trained Spanish dancers back time and time again to perform for them. People were amazed that dancing so authentic to Spain could be possibly performed outside Spain. Julia Valdez(SDS Teacher homegrown from Kent) and myself took our little budding 'Estrellitas' to many a 'Council Feria', where we joined Morris Dancers and Folk singers to get our wonderful art form seen and appreciated. No easy task when one considers that most English people (we are not talking London Folks here) think that the Fandango is something you do on the table with a rose in your mouth after a night out! In the meantime our wonderful dancers were progressing from strength to strength through the SDS examinations under the auspices of the delightful Gillian Page whose words to me when she first saw our syllabus were, 'I know a good thing when I see it' and continued to enthusiastically support Spanish Dance until her sad death last year.

So it is with great delight that we are now able to announce that her school will now be the examination centre for the SDS in Kent under my old pupil Elizabeth Gray. 'Lizzie', as we all know her, is an IdB1 Member of the SDS and along with other students of mine who have danced flamenco professionally in such far flung places as Japan and Bahrain and also the West End we warmly welcome them as they take up the baton in this Gateway to Europe (whatever the Brexit result) to continue to establish the SDS syllabus and standards of Spanish Dance throughout Kent and across the Channel.
